FERPA information (Confidentiality—which information about you can and cannot be disclosed) is printed on page 1 of the Catalog and discussed in greater detail on page 31 of the Student Handbook (Notification of Rights under FERPA for Postsecondary Institutions). The Registrar's office has your academic student files, which you may review.

Dragon Rises College has a statement of non-discrimination based on disability; on page 23 of the Catalog, and on page 1 (inside cover) of the Catalog. Loan Terms: Students who are considering borrowing money discuss the process with the Financial Aid Director or Administrator personally and can ask any and all questions, including information about unsubsidized loans, interest rates and capitalization of interest, etc. Printed repayment policies that come with each loan are given to the student at the beginning of the first loan via the Master Promissory Note. All students understand that they are borrowing money, interest is being accrued, and the fact that loans must be repaid. If a student has questions about financial aid, they can sit down with either the Financial Aid Administrator or the Financial Aid Director for a private conversation.

Alcohol, Drugs and Smoking Policy

Harassment Policy

Harassment will not be tolerated at Dragon Rises College. Harassment includes actions that can be defined as bullying, defaming, discriminatory, personal, physical, psychological, online, or sexual oriented in nature to either an individual student, faculty or staff member, administrator, or the collective college as a whole. All administrators, faculty, employees and students are charged with the responsibility for conducting themselves appropriately and professionally and for refraining from all behaviors that infringe on the rights of others. Anyone who engages in such conduct will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including immediate

termination or expulsion from the college. Dragon Rises College policy also prohibits any member of the faculty or staff from establishing and/or maintaining a social or intimate personal relationship with a student.

Sexual harassment is defined as sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when (1) submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment or academic evaluation, (2) such conduct has the purpose or effect of interfering with an individual's job or academic performance, by creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work or academic environment. Sexual harassment may, in some circumstances, consist of same gender harassment and/or peer harassment, as well as harassment by an individual with authority.

The following are examples of conduct which may constitute sexual harassment, depending upon the totality of the circumstances, including the severity of the conduct and its pervasiveness:

- Unwelcome sexual advances, whether they involve physical touching or not.
- Sexual epithets, jokes, written or spoken references to sexual conduct, gossip regarding one's sex life, comment on an individual's body, comment about an individual's sexual activity, deficiencies, prowess or preferences.
- Displaying sexually suggestive objects, pictures, cartoons, or other material.
- Inquiries into sexual experiences.
- Direct or implied requests by supervisor or faculty member for sexual favors in exchange for favorable grades, salary increases, promotions, increased benefits, or continued employment.
- Discussion of sexual activities.

Complaint Procedure: All complaints of sexual harassment must be brought immediately, either orally or in writing, to the attention of one of the following individuals: Director, Academic Dean, or Director of Admissions and Student Services. The Academic Dean serves as the College's Lead Title IX Coordinator.

It is unlawful to retaliate against an employee or student for filing a complaint of sexual harassment or for cooperating in a sexual harassment investigation.

A description of what is considered harassment, and remedies available, can be found in the Student Handbook, page 35.

Emergency Preparedness Plan

It is the policy of Dragon Rises College to preserve the safety of the College community by responding in an appropriate manner to all serious emergencies. The college has established and published emergency procedures, making them available to all students, faculty and staff. Please read and familiarize yourself with the emergency plan.

It is the policy of DRCOM to prepare for, implement a response plan to, and recover from emergencies that occur on school premises. The CEO, in consultation with Manatee County officials, crafted the content of this booklet. The Office Manager served as editor.

The emergency preparedness booklet is to be implemented beginning May 1st, 2026. It is posted throughout campus and is available upon request from any member of Administration. The Emergency Response Plan is also printed on page 38 of the Student Handbook.

The determination to close the College will be made by the Executive Director and sent to all faculty, staff, and students through the emergency announcement system. This system distributes messages to the cell phone numbers and email addresses the College has on file. The emergency announcement system is also used to notify faculty, staff, and students when the College will reopen.

Students are responsible for keeping their current cell phone number and email address on file with the College so that emergency announcements reach them.

Student emergencies. Dragon Rises College will do everything possible to assist students in a personal emergency. Students are expected to carry reasonable health insurance and are responsible for any costs incurred because of a personal or medical emergency. Students should seek the assistance of the Clinic Director or Clinic Administrator in any emergency situation; if neither is available, the Director of Admissions and Student Services or the Executive Director should be contacted. This policy is printed on page 39 of the Student Handbook.

Procedures Review and Revision

This document shall be reviewed and, if necessary, updated on an annual basis. This document is subject to change without notice. The CEO/Director is responsible for the interpretation and application of this document.

Campus Security Report

The U.S. Department of Education requires all schools participating in the Title IV financial aid programs to publish an annual security report to be distributed to all students, faculty and staff annually. This Campus Security Report must also be available to any prospective student upon request. The Office Manager, who serves as the College's designated Security Officer, is responsible for contacting the local police department to obtain the required data for the report. The information is compiled and reported to the Commission for Independent Education (CIE) through its website. The complete Campus Security Report is made available for distribution to students, faculty and staff on the College website.

Dragon Rises is committed to providing a secure and crime-free workplace for employees and a secure and crime-free environment for students and faculty. This is accomplished by performing regular evaluations of security programs on campus. Our policy is to monitor and follow-up on any crime reported. Included in the annual Campus Security Report are procedures to be followed by anyone wishing to report criminal activity on campus or anyone who is a victim of a crime. The report contains crime statistics for the three previous calendar years. The identity of victims or persons accused in the statistics included in the Campus Security Report is never revealed.

Dragon Rises College of Oriental Medicine has a policy to notify students, faculty and staff of any criminal activity which may represent a threat to its students or employees. We encourage all students, faculty and staff to accept responsibility for their own security as well as the security of other members of the Dragon Rises College community. The college has published and distributed an Emergency Procedures booklet to all members of the community. It contains specific instructions for responding to serious crimes as well as natural disasters.

Student Right-to-Know

The Student Right-to-Know Act requires schools to disclose information about completion/graduation rates to current and prospective students as well as the general public. These completion/graduation rates are provided so that students and prospective students have the information needed to make informed decisions about their education. Each October the Financial Aid Director provides a list of information or access points for information for all students directly.
